Message from Mrs Hunkin

Over the past couple of weeks Mr Barritt and I have spent some time in most classrooms carrying out monitoring of children's learning. In every class we have been delighted to observe high levels of enthusiasm and focus. Pupils' books are showing clear progress since the start of term. We have observed many instances of pupils really wanting to do their best, using high levels of vocabulary in writing and really taking on board teacher input and feedback.

As many of you are aware, we have had high levels of staff absence so far this term (I imagine that many other organisations have experienced this recently too). Unfortunately we have had to cancel a number of after-school clubs as we have been unable to sort out alternative staffing. However, we are committed to ensuring that there is good provision and continuity for pupils in their classrooms and that they are not missing out on any learning.
