Message from Mrs Hunkin

Welcome back to school and hopefully to a somewhat more normal school year than last year. I am delighted to welcome two new teachers to our team; Michael Barritt (deputy headteacher and Y4 class) and Kim Lawrence (YF teacher – job share with Mrs Harvey). We are also delighted to welcome Katie Bray back from maternity leave. She will be teaching on Wednesdays and will be spending her time between Y4 and Y5 to provide leadership time for those teachers.

Children in all classes have settled in really quickly and there seems to be a very happy atmosphere throughout the school. I am enjoying getting to know the new pupils in Foundation Class and am gradually learning everyone's names. Staff are in the process of updating the website so that class pages include details of class staff and this term's learning. Lots of exciting learning opportunities have been planned for this term – including educational visits for some classes and historical actors coming to visit other classes.

Thank you so much for your support in following new routines for drop off and pick up. These seem to working quite well and we will continually review our systems. If you need to contact your child's teacher, please either phone or e-mail the school office and we will arrange for them to get in touch with you as soon as possible.

As detailed in the information we sent before the start of term, please do not send your child to school if they have any covid-19 symptoms (temperature above 37.8, persistent new cough, loss of smell/taste) and please arrange for them to get a PCR covid test as soon as possible (a lateral flow test will not be sufficient). Any child developing a cough or temperature during the day will be kept apart from other children and sent home as soon as possible. We are aware that in many cases coughs are 'normal' for many children, particularly this time of year, and that some children regularly have a raised temperature (possibly linked to tooth or ear infection). However, school staff are not in the position to be able to determine whether or not symptoms are 'normal' or whether they might be because of Covid-19.

In the event of a positive diagnosis of Covid, all family members will need to get a PCR test. If this comes back negative, adults who are double vaccinated and children will not need to continue isolating. We will work with the NHS Track and Trace team to identify which other children will need to get a PCR test. Please be assured that we will do all we can to support your children and to ensure they catch up on missed learning.
