It's been a great few weeks back at school and Year 5 have been working hard! In Literacy we have been writing diary entries based on the class book we are reading 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo. In science we are studying forces and the children are learning about weight and mass. They have been weighing various objects using Newton meters and weighing scales, recording their findings and then making a link between the object's weight and its mass. Next week they will be planning and carrying out an investigation about air resistance using parachutes they have made in class.

Another busy week in Year 6, this week we have been writing some persuasive texts addressing the issue of lack of choice and gender stereotyping.

Some of the children have been sharing their thoughts about the lack of choice of colours and styles of clothing and footwear. This discussion then quickly spread to toys and other shopping experiences, where some pupils felt they were restricted on the choices of things they could buy.
